The entire school has been incredibly busy over the past few weeks, and our children have absolutely loved the pre-holiday winter weather! Snow has been a theme of fun all week, bringing an extra sparkle to the colder, winter days.

We are also proud to share that the whole school embraced the 'superhero' theme for Pudsey Day, and together we raised £141.40 for charity! The student councils at both schools have been actively discussing philanthropy and the charities they would like to support, helping our children understand the positive impact that charities can have and how they, too, can make a difference.

Our Ethos team continues to meet and recently we have been reflecting upon our school vision that everyone can 'let their light shine'.
