We are currently working on a number of other premises and development projects, which we will continue to update you on.

Our commitment to enriching the curriculum has been exemplified by the recent visit of the Space Dome to Thomas Bullock Academy. This immersive learning experience, generously funded by the Thomas Bullock Trust, captivated pupils from Nursery to Year 6, igniting their curiosity about the cosmos. We eagerly anticipate the Space Dome's arrival at Lyng Church of England Primary on 26th February, generously funded by the Friends of Lyng, ensuring that all our pupils benefit from this extraordinary educational opportunity.

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Oak Class


Oak have recently finished their Egyptology-inspired historical journals (The accompanying pictures show some great examples!).
