Parent Survey Results 2024

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our autumn Parent Survey. As a school, we strive for excellence in all areas, and understand that in order to do this we must always be looking for ways to improve. Listening to the views our school community is an integral part of better understanding where we need to make improvements and helps to facilitate growth across all areas.

As a team, we feel very proud to read all of the positive comments written about our school, some of which can be found below. Our staff work incredibly hard to deliver the highest levels of teaching and care to the children, and your positivity is much appreciated. But what have we done or are we doing to improve?

- School meals

In November, DNEAT partnered with a new catering provider, Nourish. We recognised that some parents were disappointed with the new menu. We have spent time monitoring the uptake of school meals, including the different choices, and have fed this data back to both the provider and the Trust and await their feedback.

- SEND Provision

As a result of the parent survey we have made changes to our SENDCo provision. Our SENDCo Mrs Smith works three days across our federation, where we only used to have provision one day a week. We have more regular on-site support from outside organisations such as the Breckland Schools and Communities Team, the Autism Support Team and we continue accessing support from our in-house pastoral support lead. We are pleased to have seen an improvement in responses following these changes.

- Behaviour


Following on from feedback received, the school has had a particular focus on supporting our children socially and emotionally. The addition of adult led activities at lunchtimes, in particular, have supported many children's wellbeing and enjoyment. Furthermore, with support staff completing 'feelings and wishes' training and weekly Nurture sessions in their infancy this highlights the schools aim to support the whole child through their behaviours and feelings.

- Communication

We strive to ensure that there is always the opportunity for you to communicate with your child's teacher and the wider school team. We think that it is important that you are aware of your child's progress and are able to access information about what your child is learning in school. We do this in various ways:

- Regular newsletters/bulletins, including half-termly class newsletters with information of learning for that half term
- Book looks
- Reception Class reading morning
- Parent / teacher consolations twice a year
- School staff on the gate both before and after school
- Full curriculum information on our website (current Nightingale Federation website under construction)
- Social media updates showcasing learning, special events and school trips
- Regular emails and messages with further information, which we have tried to amalgamate where possible to prevent a large volume in your inbox.

Parents are always welcome to telephone or email the school office with any questions or concerns. Messages can be given to teaching staff as required and telephone calls or meetings can be arranged if appropriate. We welcome constructive feedback with ideas of anything further we can do to better our communication.
